Celebration of Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh Pakhwada (1–15 November 2025)

During the Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh Pakhwada (1–15 November 2025), ICAR–NBSS&LUP, Regional Centre, Udaipur organized a series of activities at multiple locations, each with a distinct theme focusing on tribal heritage, cultural pride, the legacy of Bhagwan Birsa Munda ji, contributions of tribal freedom fighters, tribal development and government initiatives, education and skill development, scientific awareness, tribal pride, scientific agriculture, and overall socio-economic upliftment. The celebrations formally commenced on 01 November 2025 to 15 November 2025 .

The first major event was held on 06 November 2025 at Govt.
